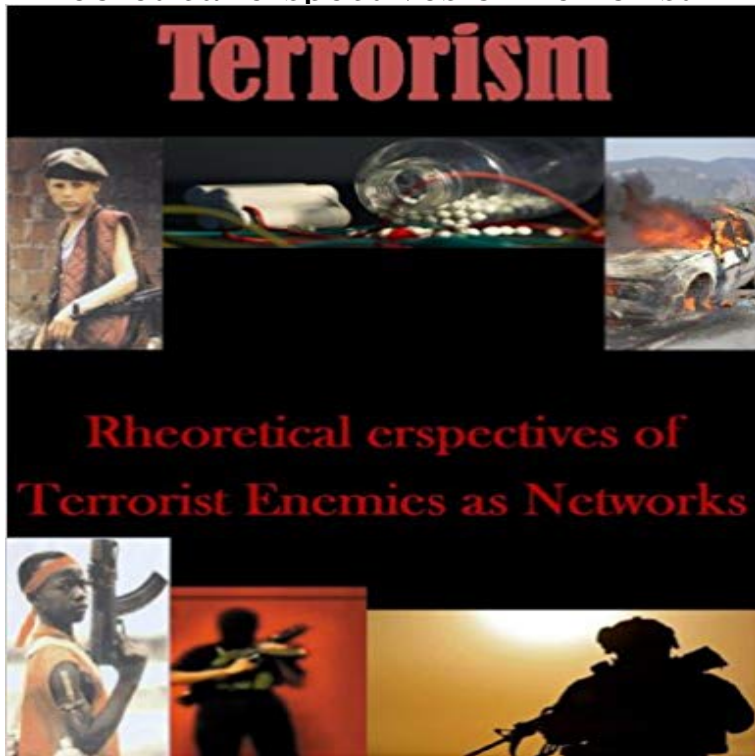


Rheoretical erspectives of Terrorist Enemies as Networks
