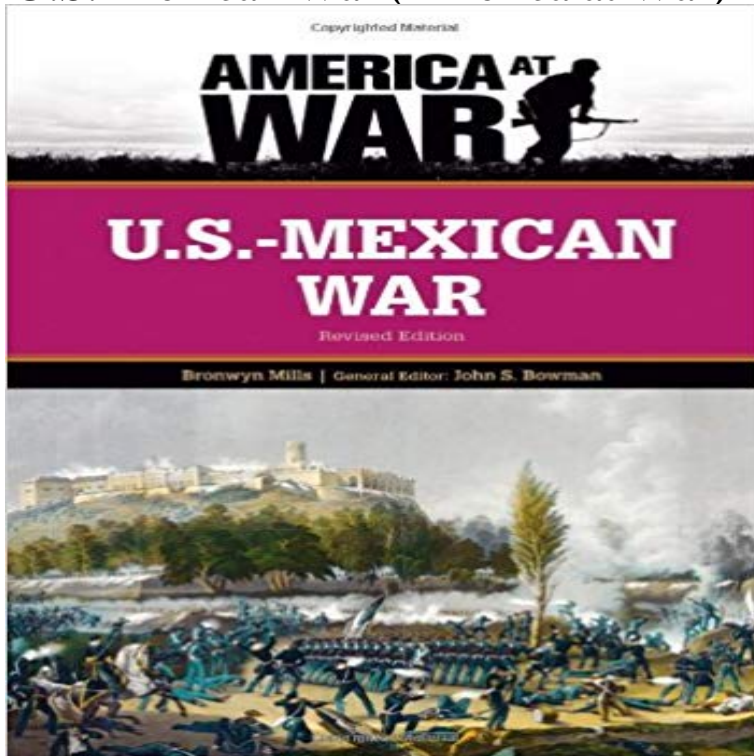


U.S.-Mexican War (America at War)
