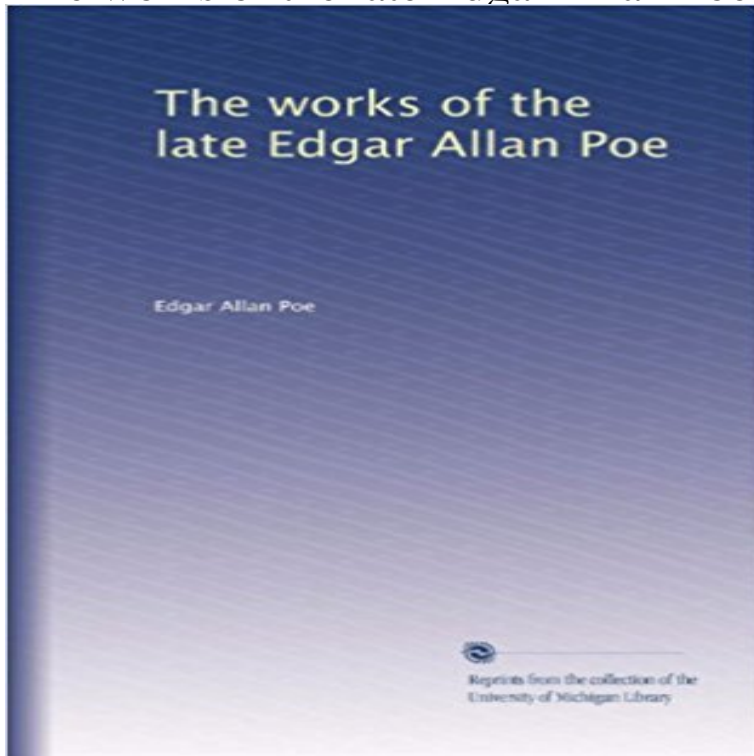


## The works of the late Edgar Allan Poe (Volume 2)
